## Course VS001: Value Solutions, Module I – Value Methodology Fundamentals

The focus of this course is to acquaint participants with the use of the Value Methodology (VM) process, often referred to as value analysis, value engineering or value management.

**Course topics include:** Introduction to the Value Methodology; Typical Applications and Examples; Background and Basic Value Concept; VM Job Plan, Team & Workshop Foundation; Workshop Phases – Information, Function Analysis, Creativity, Evaluation, Development, Presentation; - Acceptance of Proposals; Implementation and Follow-up Plan for Sustaining Results. Participants apply the Value Methodology and related decision-enabling skills to an actual project to gain practical experience using the lessons learned.

**Duration:** 40 hours: 2+3 day training workshop.

**Course Format:** 20 hours lectures interspersed with (minimum of) 20 hours hands-on workshop using reference project. Satisfies SAVE International requirements for an interactive workshop process to address aspects of VM history, the VM job plan, function analysis, creativity, evaluation and implementation, together with "people" topics.

**Who Should Attend:** Project staff who are likely to participate in Value studies or have Value studies conducted on their projects. Managers who are responsible for initiating, co-ordinating or reviewing the results of Value programs or studies. Persons wishing to support Value workshops, or progress through the various formal certification stages. Previous participants have included engineers, architects, quantity surveyors, project managers and various others professionals from owner, consultant and contracting organizations.

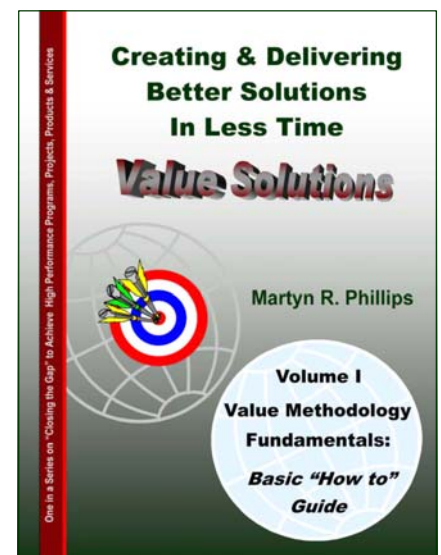
